#### **DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:**

David Hansen, Northwest Community Service – Grow Local Update Mayor Leclerc welcomed David Hansen of Northwest Community Service to the Council Meeting.

Mr. Hansen addressed Council. Grow Local is a provincially funded initiative to increase community food security. Grow Local has been working with low income families and seniors to install raised garden beds and increase food growing knowledge in the community. Grow Local has built 45 garden boxes in 39 locations throughout the community. They have had the support of New Haven Ventures, Just Cut It Sawmilling, Home Hardware, JL's Excavating, West Coast Seeds, The Spotted Horse Nursery, and The City of Terrace.

Mr. Hansen is sub-contracting to the Kermode Friendship Society. In doing this, they have successfully been able to partner with the Grow Local program to get people who are at risk of homelessness connected to the labour market.

Garden boxes were successfully built at a number of daycares in town in order to make connections with children.

For next spring, Grow Local has enough in their budget to go back and re-seed the existing boxes. Mr. Hansen is hoping the program will eventually be up scaled in the future. This project has been a great initiative to promote food security in the area.

Mr. Hansen thanked the Provincial Government and the City of Terrace for their support.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Mr. Hansen for his presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 333).
